Using Gnomio as a Platform

1. Create an Account:

- o Go to the Gnomio website.
- o Click on "Create a Moodle" to start your registration.
- o Enter your preferred site name (this will form your Moodle URL, e.g., yoursite.gnomio.com), email address, and other required details.
- o Confirm your account through the activation link sent to your email.

2. Set Up Your Course:

- o After creating your account, log in to your Moodle site on Gnomio.
- As an administrator, you can create new courses by navigating to the "Site
 administration" menu, selecting "Courses," and then clicking on "Add a new
 course."
